See, for example, p. 3: "[It is well known that] Kidney transplantation is considered the gold standard of treatment for most patients with end-stage renal disease". In this sentence, we have deleted the phrase "It is well known that" because it is implied.

In some cases, we have inserted a specific subject in place of a pronoun that has been used to start a sentence. See, for example, p. 5: "[They] These specialists are organized as a team combining their specific skills". In this case, we have replaced "They" with "These specialists" to clarify the subject of the sentence.

Please review our edits and comments throughout the manuscript to ensure that your intended meaning is represented accurately and clearly.
