1. Format has been updated.
2. Revisión has been made according to the suggestions of the reviewer.
  - 2.1. 1. The waiting list to perform an upper endoscopy is high so to avoid it we decided to perform a jejunal biopsy by the Crosby capsule in case you really don't need to observe the intestinal mucosal but only get the biopsy. 2. Trichophagia and trichotillomania in this patient is more likely due to behavioural disorders secondary to celiac disease, so right after starting a GFD, trichophagia and trichotillomania was rapidly corrected. 3. We corrected the affiliation of Dr. Juan Carlos Vitoria and typos errors.
  - 2.2. We clarify the expression in the manuscript.
  - 2.3. The manuscripts was reviewed by professional English language companies.
  - 2.4. The association of celiac disease and trichophagia has been previously described but only in patients with iron deficiency anemia. In our case, behavioral disorder due to celiac disease rather than to anemia, that was not previously reported.
