This manuscript present the results on gastric ulcers by an extract administration. The quality is adequate. However many markers were measured, but direct links are lacking. The limitations could be minimized if authors include the potential molecules which can be included and could be involved in the suggested mechanisms. -Discussion could be



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in a deeper form regarding the putative compounds responsible for action and the mode of action involved in the hormone action (beyond prostaglandin levels in a point). - One group of rats gonadectomized, but with treatment with steroid-hormones could be useful. Or at least the reported data included and discussed.
