It is a well written manuscript. There are minor grammatical errors such as lesson learnt is written as lesson learned. I feel that it may be edited a bit to make it more concise. At present it is somewhat lengthy. The discussion about Alfie may not be needed in



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conclusion. I feel that it should focus only on the cases mentioned and the relation between the choices available and made for the patient, and what could have been the best at that point of time. This may then be generalized.
