SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The article is a case report that induces some considerations: the possible complications of PD are well described in the literature as well as the consequences of PF after PD. The formation of hematoma caused by vascular erosion is also a known occurrence and as



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such does not represent an element of novelty. But I have some concerns about this case:

a) The haematoma occurred in 12 day PO. Was the fistula earlier or occurred on the same day? If it was pre-existing what measures had been taken; Drainage, wait? b) If it was pre-existing, had diagnostic tests been carried out to assess its dangerousness? c) In the discussion, rather than the description of the events and the measures adopted following the hematoma, it would be interesting to consider the possible causes of the fistula and possibly what prophylactic procedures to adopt. d) The reported complication is late and also its treatment. Could a more accurate diagnosis of the size of the fistula suggest a more timely intervention and fewer patient problems? I think the article to be of interest should contain these considerations.
