Remarks to the Author: The manuscript titled " Pancreatic panniculitis and solid pseudopapillary tumor of the pancreas "has been reviewed. This is potentially important manuscript. However, it seems the manuscript lacks of novelty. Further, I was



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unable to identify the main point of this manuscript. Critique: The authors should prepare the macroscopic view of specimen of the resected pancreas. it was difficult to interpret the figure 4 and its figure legend authors provided. In all panels have no scale. A: What is this staining for? Oil red? B: The authors should prepare not only low but also high magnification of panels. C: What is this staining? Besides, the authors describe as Immunophenotyping showed Syn(+), CD56(+), CD10(+), β -catenin(+), Vim(+), AE1/AE3(+), PR(+), CgA(-), E-cad(-), and Ki-67(+/3%). However, there is no staining in the figure.

Solid pseudopapillary tumor of the pancreas (SPTP) is a rare pancreatic exocrine tumor which is difficult to diagnose before surgery. And pancreatic panniculitis is a rare type that occurs less than 3% of all patients with pancreatic diseases. In this case report the



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author describe the diagnosis and treatment of SPTP accompanied with pancreatic panniculitis in a young woman with Contrast-enhanced ultrasound and abdominal CT and pathological examinations. Furthermore, the clinic data is very detailed. This case told us we should be aware of the clinical manifestation and treatment of pancreatic panniculitis. Although SPTP has good prognosis and the postoperative 5-year survival rate is high, efforts should be made to further increase diagnostic accuracy and optimize therapeutic methods, so as to improve the quality of life of SPTP patients.

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
