Some frequently presenting indolent behavior, while others occasionally evolves to high-grade neoplasms, the underlying molecular determinant reflect tumor heterogeneity are still largely unknown. The urgent need to be further studied and establish up-to-date criteria for differential diagnosis and the clinical behavior, refine morpho-molecular assessment will contribute better precision management.
