**SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS**

In this article, Sandra et al reported a patient with Shwachman-Diamond syndrome (SDS) who had cirrhosis, a relatively rare complication of SDS. I have the following concerns: 1) I fully agree that cirrhosis is a rare complication of SDS but the diagnosis of cirrhosis in



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this case was apparently unclear. Cirrhosis usually presented at the late stage of chronic liver damage. It's not common in a 32-month old boy particularly his liver inflammation was not severe according to the ALT level. The authors must provide more solid evidences supporting the diagnosis of cirrhosis. If the liver biopsy was performed, the pathological results should be showed. Did the liver biopsy sample stained for cirrhosis markers? Did the patients have any radiological exams e.g. MRI, CT, Ultrasound or Fibroscan with any support for the presence of cirrhosis? 2) The authors should give more detail about the mutation of SBDS gene of the patient as well as his family history. 3) In the figure, why the ALT data form age 4 to age 9 were missing?

**SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS**

We read with interest the paper entitled: “Cirrhosis complicating Shwachman-Diamond syndrome: case report and review of the literature” by Sandra M. Camacho et al. It is a case report of a 16-month-old white male presented with failure to thrive first noted



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around 2-months of age, persistent hyper-transaminasemia and developing an histologically proven cirrhosis at 32 months of age. Cirrhosis was cryptogenic since all the etiologic tests including a panel of genetic tests were negative. This is a nice report of a SDS with severe hepatic involvement which is, as stated by the authors, quite infrequent in these patients (only five patients described by an old review) even in presence of mild elevation of aminotransferase and mild hepatomegaly. The clinical history is well detailed even though any data on imaging, either ultrasounds or CT/MRI were described. Hepatic involvement in SD syndrome has been only marginally addressed in the past years being the most recent contribution from 2009. Review of the literature is concise and references seem to be updated. Language is good and does not deserve major editing
