Reply to peer review coment 1: Sample size was calculated for the primary outcome (satisfactory colonic cleansing), so we cannot be sure if the lack of abdominal pain in the constipated subgroup can be due to a type II error. Even though bisacodyl mechanism of action is not clearly understood abdominal pain has been described as a drug adverse effect. Curiously constipated patients, in which the administrations of bisacodyl is indicated because it improve constipation related symptoms, doesn't seem to present abdominal pain during colonic preparation.
