## SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

Aortic arch anomalies is not a rare condition. These congenital abnormalities is encountered during radial coronary angiograph as well as symptoms such as dysphagia or dyspnea. Prevalence of an isolated common carotid has been reported in about 13% of the general population. An aberrant RSCA arising as the last branch of the aortic arch is the most common type of congenital aortic arch anomaly with a reported incidence of 0.2-2%.<sup>6</sup> The combination of aberrant RSCA with a common carotid trunk is exceedingly rare with an estimated prevalence of <0.05%. In this paper bilateral common trunk carotid artery with an aberrant right subclavian artery. This situation is rare, On the other hands calcification and stenosis on the aberrant right subclavian artery and doppler findings depicting subclavian steal is interesting. Although aneurysm formation at the site of aortic attachment is reported, this situation has not frequently reported before. It may merit to publiaction
