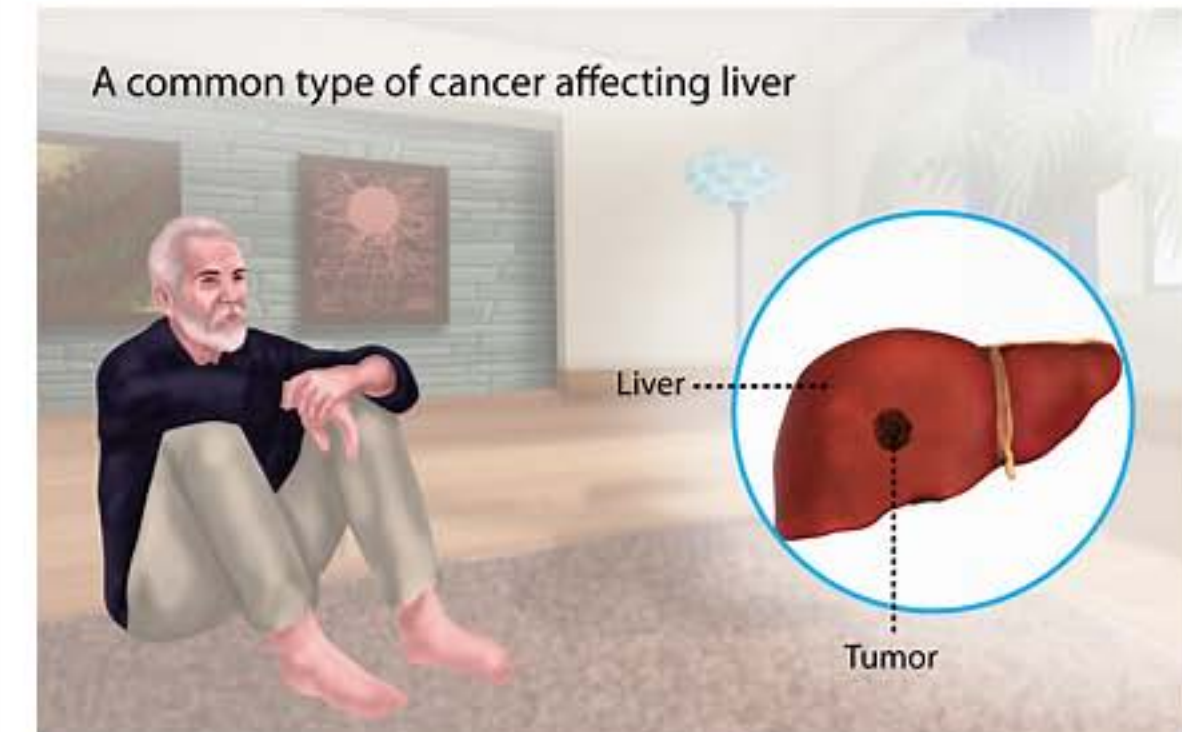

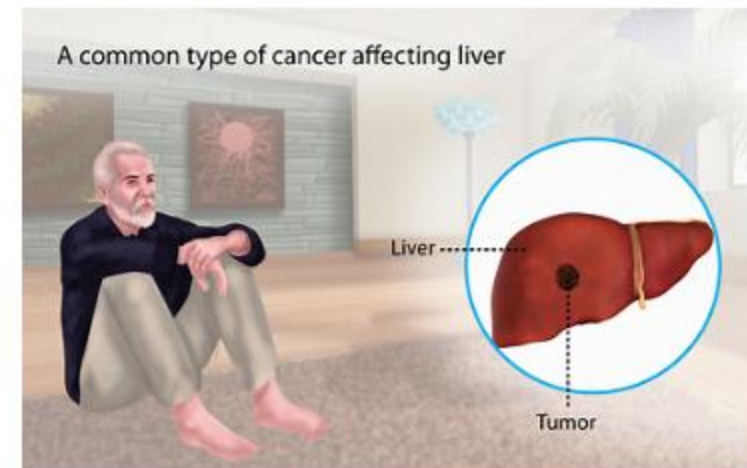

- **Chemotherapy:** Therapy where the drugs are used to kill the cancer
