The manuscript “Alagille syndrome associated with total anomalous pulmonary venous connection and severe xanthomas: A case report” by Hanshi Zeng et al presents an interesting case report, i.e. a rare association of the Alagille syndrome with a total anomalous pulmonary venous connection (TAPVC). The manuscript is concise and well written and the discussion is thorough. The authors suggest that mutations in the JAG1 gene may also be related to TAPVC, as well as other more frequent cardiac malformations. The text needs minor revision.
