The goal of medical therapy in upper gastrointestinal bleeding (UGIB) is to correct shock and coagulation abnormalities and to stabilize the patient so that further evaluation and treatment can proceed. High doses of proton pump inhibitors may reduce the need for endoscopic therapy (see Treatment with proton pump inhibitors). Pulmonary artery catheters may be helpful to guide therapy. Foley catheter placement is mandatory to allow a continuous evaluation of the urinary output as a guide to renal perfusion. This lab...
