SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors have made an extensive review of the published work in PTLN and have made recommendations about management. My comments are: 1. The study design is not elucidated. Please explain and in particular what statistical analyses were done to determine the adequacy of these studies. Do they have type 1 or type 2 errors for example? 2. Although the authors have recommendations for management some are “hard or established” and some “soft or experimental”. I think it would help the reader if those established principles were listed with the evidence and likewise for the experimental group with evidence. 3. Overall, I suggest that greater emphasis should be placed upon a critical evidence base to evaluate PTLN management. This includes the drugs used (e.g. rituximab), the use of viral load; the use of CSF recovery and other factors 4. The carcinogenic subtype of EBV is critical to PTLN and should be discussed. 5. The authors claim in the introduction that there is “growing incidence of PTLN”: please provide the evidence 6. It should also be made clear that immunosuppression is a risk factor for almost all cancers in transplantation and that those risks can be increased by immunosuppression used to treat primary renal disease before renal transplantation 7. Remove emotional words such as “devastating disorder” 8. Writing style needs some attention: repetition, grammar, meaning of some sentences

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
