Authors This case report is very interesting because the rarity of this liver pathology (liver infarction) and the great difficulty of the diagnosis. The case presentation is well developed. I have some doubts and questions about the management of the case; it's necessary to explain your diagnostic way to malignant neoplastic lesion. Can there be the malignant hepatic tumors, in particular the more frequent hepatocellular carcinoma, without peripheral vascular contrast enhancement in CT scan? And also what are the characteristic features of unusual hepatic tumors on CT, MRI examination? I think that can be useful to clarify your therapeutic choice. The Discussion reports many data from the literature in particular on etiology of liver infarction; in summary is clear and complete. The Conclusion is related to the content of case presented. The Table and Figures are clear and appropriate. The References are up-to-date. This manuscript needs only a minor revision.
