It was a very valuable case. I have some topics that needed to be addressed: When exactly did the patient's complaints begin? Did the patient describe neurogenic claudication? Was there a vascular risk factor in the patient's history? Did the patient have a history of diabetes mellitus and hypothyroidism? Could you describe the patient's neurological examination in detail? How was muscle strength? How was serum creatine kinase level? When were imaging examinations performed? Did he have a sequence of MR diffusion? Why was MRI not performed for lumbar imaging? Why was the EMG not performed? A rare side effect of milnacipran is hyponatremia. Could it have potentiated the effect of oxcarbazepine?
