I have read with great interest the manuscript entitled 'Hepatic Hemangioma: What



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Internists Need to Know?' submitted to the World Journal of Gastroenterology. In this minireview article, the pathogenesis, symptoms, growth pattern, diagnosis and management of hepatic hemangioma are deeply discussed. The manuscript is generally well written, despite minor comments below. The major limitations of this article are its design (narrative review, thus with a high risk of bias) and the fact that there is no novelty because this topic is of wide knowledge of the journal readers. Minor comments: • In the abstract, please explain the abbreviation HH in the first use • There is a typo in the 'Symptoms' section (satiety) • Please amend the following phrase to avoid generalisation: 'however symptoms present when a HH is larger than >5 cm'

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hepatic hemangioma. This manuscript will be suggestive to internists; however, there are some issues for acceptance. Major point In non-surgical management, the effect of anti-VEGF was referred, thus the authors should molecularly explain the pathogenesis of HH, such as mTORC1-VEGF pathway. Minor point In abstract, the abbreviation is not appropriate. "Hepatic Hemangioma" should change "Hepatic Hemangioma (HH)" in the first line.

In the last paragraph, the author didn't give a clear conclusion regarding the management of liver hemangioma, especially the trend of reflecting minimal invasive or non-surgical therapy, including the opinions of the author himself. 3. The references are too many, be better less than 50.
