I suggest to change it to "surgical resection effect of complicated liver cancer and its influencing factors: A retrospective study" 2. Abstract. The real back ground is missing, the background now is the aim of the study. 3. The methods are described in detail. The sample size is enough. Inclusion and exclusion criteria are clear. 4. Results are very interesting. The data in tables are excellent. However, there are some Chinese comma, which should be revised. 5. Discussion. The results were well discussed, with updated references. 6. Some minor language polishing required a minor editing.
