The manuscript “Small intestinal hemolymphangioma treated with enteroscopic injection sclerotherapy: a case report and review of literature” is an interesting case report of a rare combined vascular malformation located in the small bowel presenting as obscure GI bleeding (OGIB). This type of malformation is extremely rare as a cause of OGIB. According to capsule endoscopy result series, angiodysplasia is the most common source of bleeding (50 - 70%). Other less frequent benign vascular malformations are capillary or cavernous hemangiomas, Dieulafoy lesion and lymphangiectasia. GIB due to angiodysplasia es commonly treated with Argon Plasma Coagulation or somatostatin analogues and Dieulafoy lesion is commonly treated with radiologic embolization or endoscopically applied hemoclips The case presented in this report has some particularities: 1. There is no experience in the treatment of this entity 2. It is a benign lesion, so surgical treatment must be avoided as first line 3. Any hemostatic procedure is useful for treating active bleeding of this lesions 4. If sclerotherapy is useful for the short and long term treatment it should be taken int account in other cases.
