Following the suggestion of one the reviewers, we divided table 2 into two others, one with the significant variables and the other with the non-significant variables. In relation to the table where the relative risk of the variables is exposed, we prefer to keep it because it is not so extensive and the set of information makes the reader's understanding broader.

The inclusion of the systematic review article was done in the text and also in the references

Another question was about the choice of the Distrito Federal state as the reference category for interpretation of the odds ratio in all logistic regression (univariate and multiple multinomial). Brasilia is the Federal capital of Brazil, with a mixed population of immigrants from other brazilian states and their descendents. This is an interesting reference center, well organized and never included in any IBD brazilian epidemiological study. According to the reviewer suggestion we included a better definitions of brazilian regions and states in the section Material and Methods.
