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1) General comments Dr. Hu, Dr. Wang and Dr. Yang, et al. reported 'Mesenteric phlebosclerosis with amyloidosis in association with the long-term use of medicinal liquor: a case report'. The article is informative. The reviewer has some comments. Comments 1) The authors reported MP with amyloidosis. The reviewer doubts the diagnosis of amyloidosis in this case. Because this Congo red staining might be weak and a false-positive in Fig. 4. The authors should show Congo red stain under polarizer filter showing in green, and classify the type of amyloidosis such as AL, AA. Then, the authors should diagnose amyloidosis carefully. 2) In this case, 1 year after discontinued the Chinese medicinal liquor, the mesenteric vein calcification was disappeared in abdominal CT findings. Please describe the other reports that the mesenteric vein calcification was disappeared after discontinued medicines which might be caused MP.

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
