Axenfeld-Rieger syndrome (ARS) is an autosomal dominant genetic disease characterized by ocular developmental disorders and its association with torsion of wandering spleen (WS) has not been reported to date to the best of our knowledge. This study aimed to describe a rare case of ARS observed at our emergency department.

While this has not been directly studied, this suggests an **association** of other **congenital anomalies** with **wandering spleen**. There are no previously reported cases of **wandering spleen** in a patient with **DiGeorge syndrome**. However, there is a known **association of renal agenesis**, among other urogenital anomalies, with **DiGeorge syndrome**. We hypothesize that our patient's underlying genetic defect gave rise to **renal agenesis**, which may have some **association** with **wandering spleen**.
