This report of a rare tumor could be useful to clinicians dealing with such issues. I have a couple of suggestions for improvement of the presentation: A. If available, provide information about the death of the patient. Was it due to distal metastases or other causes? B. Receive help with the English of the report. I will provide a few examples. a. line 64: "...therapeutic outcome ...has been remarkably improved...", not "elevated" b. line 73: add "and is" before "especially misled..." c. lines 86-87: change to "...irreducible, the left testicle was not palpable and transillumination test was positive." d. line 103: change to: "...which lead to the diagnosis..." e. lines 148-149: change the sentence to "Lack of pain in the mass contributed sometimes to therapeutic delays."
