Besides the anatomical factors causing recurrent disease, several other comorbidities increase the risk of anal fistula recurrence. These factors include anal cancer [22], Crohn's disease [23], diabetes [24], smoking [25], and an immunosuppressed state like HIV [26].

Usually results from infection near the anus which causes an abscess. Unpleasant symptoms such as pain, irritation around the anus, discomfort and discharge are seen. Treatment mainly involves surgery.

Symptoms

- Pain which is constant and throbbing and which may worsen when you sit down or move around
- Swelling and redness around the anus
- Discharge of blood or pus from the anus
- Skin irritation around the anus
