Reviewer 1

**QUESTION 1:** The paper is well written, with very few grammatical issues that can be easily addressed. I have only one concern that is terminological: gliosis is not the same thing as gliomatosis. Authors have some time used both terms as exchangeable, which might confuse readers. Are you talking about gliosis (in this specific case) or gliomatosis (which is, by far, much more infaust?).

**ANSWER 1:** Thank you for the review and these remarks. The grammatical issues have been addressed and the text has been proofread again.

We agree with the respected reviewer that these two terms are completely different. We apologise for the inconvenience, it was our mistake and our inconsistency during writing. The correct term was gliomatosis, as this was also seen in the histological specimen, taken from the tumour during the biopsy. In the text, this was corrected and the actual histological changes, that were provoked, supposingly by the bacteria, were those of the gliomatosis cerebri.
