Answers to Reviewer #1’s comments:

Question 1

There are significant language issues throughout the abstract and manuscript. For this to be published in English, I believe it will require major editing.

Question 2

Do you have endoscopy or histology images from later in the patient’s course, when they are clinically doing well? Would be helpful to compare.

Answer: We have follow-up endoscopy images and have inserted them into the article. See the **figure 4**.

Question 3

Do you use any grading system for patient's symptoms or for the endoscopy images? Mayo Endoscopic Score (MES) and Ulcerative Colitis Endoscopic Index of Severity (UCEIS) are two examples. Again, would be helpful to compare score at presentation with score at 26 months.

Answer: Disease activity and extent were determined, and the activity of the mucosal inflammation was scored using the Mayo endoscopic subscore(MES).See the **table 1**

Question 4

Are there any genetic markers associated with GDUC

Answer: We searched the literature related to this question. Several studies have reported the susceptibility genes of inflammatory bowel disease, such as NOD2. However, it seems that there is no evidence for genetic markers associated with GDUC. More research may be needed to solve this problem.
