1. Why did the authors focus on children and adolescents population rather than adults population? 2. Why did the authors only discuss the four medical conditions (including asthma, obesity, chronic kidney disease and COVID-19) rather than others? 3. The authors provide "The age-standardized global prevalence of CKD stages 1–5 in adults aged 20 and older has been estimated at 10.4% in men and 11.8% in women...." in Chronic kidney disease section page 17, but why didn't provide the data in children and adolescents? 4. The authors should provide some sections in "A broad and integrative perspective of evidence-based, gender-oriented health policy", the readers would catch the points easily.
