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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This case report is about the cutaneous ciliated cyst on the anterior neck in young women. Cutaneous ciliated cyst is defined as a rare, painless lesion frequently encountered on the lower extremities of young girls after puberty. It has been reported the scalp, scapula, thumb, abdomen, umbilicus, knee. This pathological observation on the anterior neck remains largely undisclosed. Several minor points should be addressed: 1) In the Introduction section, "Cutaneous ciliated cyst (CCC) was first reported in 1996 by Clarke". In fact, Farmer and Helwig had firstly defined the cutaneous ciliated cyst in 1978. (Farmer E. R., Helwig E. B. Cutaneous ciliated cysts. Archives Dermatology. 1978;114(1):70-73) 2) As to immunohistochemical profiles about CCC, in many cases, progesterone receptor (PR) expressions, PAX8, CEA or WT-1 was positive. These immunohistochemical results (positive or not) should be provided. 3) At surgical excision, the gross image about cutaneous ciliated cyst on the anterior neck should be provided.
