Response: We thank the referee for this comment. We changed the title of manuscript "Emerging techniques of artificial Intelligence in Gastroenterology: a review of the literature in "Emerging artificial Intelligence applications in Gastroenterology: a review of the literature".

- Too much of non- AI text as prelude, for eg, Barretts / Gastric cancer etc, consider trimming the general text and adhere to AI related information

Response: We fully agree with this comment. We reduced the introductory text as requested for the following paragraphs: "Artificial Intelligence and Barrett's esophagus and esophageal cancer", "Artificial Intelligence and Gastric Cancer (GC)", "Artificial Intelligence in the identification of Helicobacter Pylori infection", Artificial Intelligence for colonic polyps and colon cancer.

- A few statements, not clear, to quote in page 3 "CNN takes machine learning a step further, the deep learning, to function similarly to the human brain.' There are many similar statements, that prove difficult for a general GI physician to understand, I would recommend to attend these grammatical components to make the manuscript more reader friendly
