The article is interesting due to the anastomosing hemangioma characterized by isolated main left renal vein involvement. However, there is a case report in the literature that is characterized by segmental renal vein involvement, and it is recommended to be included in the discussion. Also in the literature, there are articles on the genetic background and mutations of anastomosing hemangiomas, and the discussion part of the article should be enriched. In line 187, the lack of letters in the word "arterial phase" should be corrected. Numerous radiological images (CT and MR images) and radiological comments were made in the article. Is there a radiologist among the authors? If there is no radiologist among the authors, how do you explain that there are many radiological images (CT and MR images) and radiological comments in the article, but that the authors were not included?
