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#### **SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS**

The authors presented a remarkable case, concerned with hypersensitivity pneumonitis HRCT diagnosis. Despite HRCT patterns of hypersensitivity pneumonitis have already described in scientific literature, there are a lot of peculiarities in hypersensitivity pneumonitis HRCT-presentation, leading to diagnostic pitfalls, especially in individuals with no clear anamnesis of allergens exposure. There are small problems in case report:

- I did not find the keywords list and any references in "Introduction";
- authors used the word "nodulares" instead of "nodule(s)", latter is more common and natural for HRCT phenomena description. This case report could recommend to publication after correction problems listed above.
