September 23, 2020 Review for World Journal of Gastroenterology Manuscript "Clinical features and therapeutic strategies of multiple gastrointestinal stromal tumors (MGIST): A pooling analysis combined with evidence and gap" This is an exceptionally zealously searched and comprehensive review of the two rare disease entities, in particular, MGIST Authors undertook an impressive literature search for the reports in the world and examined in the detail to identify the rare disease, MGIST which was often misdiagnosed as metastatic GIST. The misdiagnosis may result in the inappropriate management for patients with MGIST. The authors tried to establish definite diagnosis of MGIST since the different treatment may be necessary for MGIST. From the 43 publications they studied, 12 patients with MGIST were identified among the potential 161 patients examined. Based on their multiple and detailed data of the patients and others described in this manuscript, it is hopeful that a clear guidelines for diagnosis and proper management for MGIST would be produced. It is an extensive survey and the authors are commended for their efforts.
