<b>Patient Information</b>	<b>6a</b>	De-identified demographic and other patient or client specific information	<u>P5, L87-97</u>
	<b>6b</b>	Chief complaint—what prompted this visit?	<u>P5, L108-111</u>
	<b>6c</b>	Relevant history including past interventions and outcomes	<u>P5, L114-115</u>
<b>Physical Exam</b>	<b>7</b>	Relevant physical examination findings	<u>P6, L125-128</u>
<b>Diagnostic Assessment</b>	<b>8a</b>	Evaluations such as surveys, laboratory testing, imaging, etc.	<u>P6, L130-143</u>

<b>Interventions</b>	<b>9a</b>	Types such as life-style recommendations, treatments, medications, surgery	<u>P7, L174-175</u>

<b>Patient Perspective</b>	<b>12</b>	When appropriate include the assessment of the patient or client on this episode of care	<u>P8, L179-180</u>
<b>Informed Consent</b>	<b>13</b>	Informed consent from the person who is the subject of this case report is required by most journals	<u>✓</u>
