SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

I would like to thank the authors for their time and efforts on their work. The paper represents a literature review on a rare clinical entity, hepatic angiomyolipoma (HAML). They summarize the clinical characteristics of patients with HAML and propose a pragmatic approach for management of HAML. This review can serve as a good resource for providers encountering patients with HAML with no to general experience on this topic, like myself. Specific Comments: 1. The title should be expanded to represent the content and the type of the study, such as "Clinical Characteristics and Outcomes of Patients with Hepatic Angiomyolipoma: A Literature Review" rather than just "Hepatic Angiomyolipoma". 2. I suggest expanding the introduction to better highlight the importance of the topic, and why the reader should continue reading the paper. The authors briefly mentioned these reasons "difficult radiological diagnosis, potential aggressive behavior, and poorly codified management" in the introduction and further discussed them in the rest of the paper, but I suggest elaborating on each single point with relevant references in the introduction. Perhaps, a paragraph of 8-10 lines summarizing these points would be sufficient. 3. In Patient Characteristics, the abbreviations ACE and CA 19-9 appeared first in the text without full expansion. 4. For Table 1, I suggest adding a column for outcomes.
