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## Non-keratinizing squamous cell carcinoma - Nasopharynx

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**Non-keratinizing squamous cell carcinoma** is a type of **cancer** that develops from the **squamous cells** in the epithelium of the **nasopharynx**. Another name for this tumour is **nasopharyngeal carcinoma**. This tumour is called **non-keratinizing** because unlike other tumours that start from **squamous cells**, the **cells** in **non-keratinizing squamous cell carcinoma** do not make large amounts of a protein called keratin.

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## Delayed diagnosis of a primary intraosseous squamous cell ...

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**Primary intraosseous squamous cell carcinoma** is a rare malignant central jaw tumor derived from odontogenic epithelial remnants. Predominantly, it affects mandible, although both jaw bones may be involved. This **report** describes a 60-year-old man who was initially misdiagnosed with a periapical infection related to the right lower wisdom tooth.

Discussion. Pure **primary squamous cell carcinoma** of the breast is a rare condition and is considered to arise through metaplastic change of ductal **carcinoma** cells []. The concept of a disease continuum with varying degrees of **squamous** metaplasia was supported by Stevenson et al. who conclude that SqCC mostly represents an extreme form of **squamous** metaplasia within adenocarcinoma [].
