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## Hepatocellular Carcinoma

Medical Condition

The most common form of liver cancer often seen in people with chronic liver diseases like cirrhosis.

- Rare (Fewer than 200,000 cases per year in US)
- May be preventable by vaccine
- Often requires lab test or imaging
- Treatment from medical professional advised
- Can last several months or years

Caused mainly due to the chronic infection of the liver or DNA mutation of the liver cells. Characterized by unexplained weight loss, upper abdominal pain and yellowing of the skin. Treatment options include hepatectomy, target drug delivery and the use of radiation to kill the cancerous cells.

### Symptoms

The early stages of the disease do not present any symptoms but in the later stages the symptoms which are noted are as follows:

- Upper abdominal pain
- Weight loss
- Jaundice
- Fluid in the abdomen
- Liver failure

### Treatments

Treatment option which is employed depends on the stage of the condition, size and location of the tumor.

#### Medication

- Chemotherapy: Therapy where the drugs are used to kill the cancer cells.  
5-Fluorouracil · Capecitabine · Irinotecan · Oxaliplatin
- Target drug delivery: Drugs which are target oriented help in slowing down the progression of the disease.  
Sorafenib

**Medical procedures:** Hepatectomy · Liver transplantation · Ablation

**Therapies:** Radiation therapy

### Causes

The exact cause of this condition is not clear, but the proposed causes include:

- Chronic infection with certain hepatitis viruses
- DNA mutation of the liver cells

Risk factors for development of this condition include:

- Cirrhosis
- Certain inherited liver disease
- Diabetes
- Accumulation of fat in the liver
- Exposure to aflatoxin
- Excessive alcohol consumption
