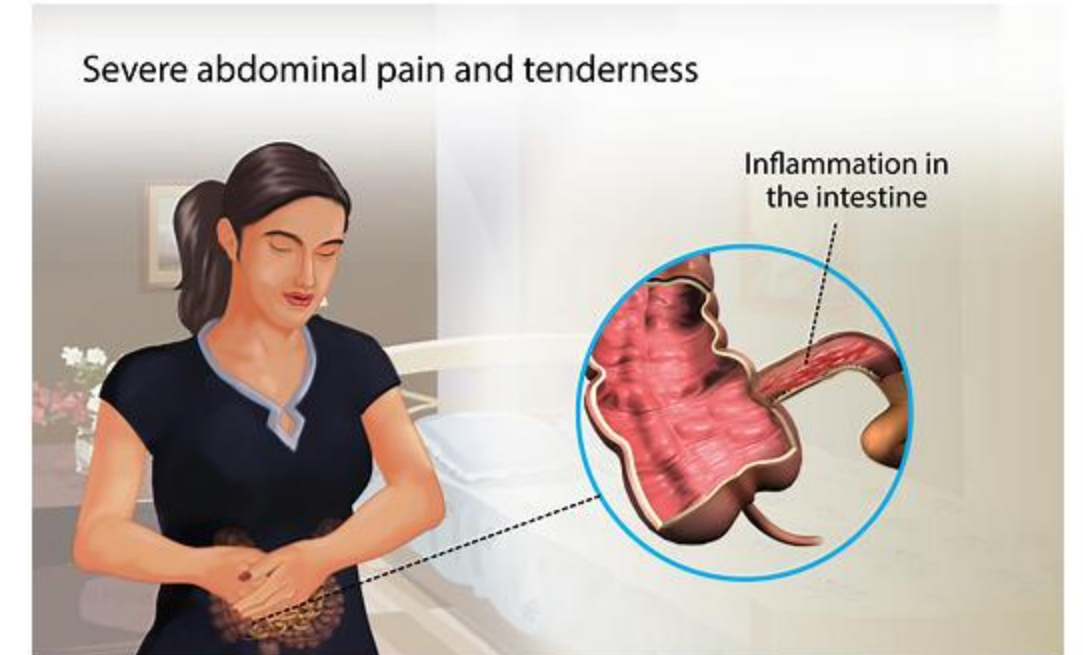

Definition. **Crohn's disease** is a chronic inflammatory condition of the gastrointestinal tract, characterised by transmural granulomatous inflammation, a discontinuous pattern of distribution, and fistulae. Although any part of the digestive tract from mouth to anus may be affected, **Crohn's disease** most frequently occurs in the terminal ileum, ileocaecal region, **colon**, and perianal region.

## Crohn's Disease


Medical Condition

A chronic inflammation of the digestive tract.

 Rare (Fewer than 200,000 cases per year in US)

 Requires lab test or imaging

 Treatments can help manage condition, no known cure

 Can be lifelong

The exact cause is unknown but heredity and malfunctioning immune system play a role. Common symptoms include abdominal pain, diarrhea, malnutrition and fatigue. Anti-inflammatory drugs and immune system suppressors help in long term remission.

## Symptoms

Symptoms range from mild to severe and include:

- Abdominal pain and tenderness
- Feeling of a filled abdomen
- Tiredness
- Diarrhea, which can be mixed with blood, mucus or pus in severe cases
- Constipation
- Nausea
- Weight loss
- Fever
- Rectal bleeding
- Inflammation of the joints, eyes, and mouth

Children with crohn's disease may report retarded growth or delayed sexual development.
