The authors presented a manuscript describing a case report of a patient with a rare urological life-threatening infectious condition. They have also included the precautions they took for surgical management of a patient during the COVID-19 pandemic and reflected that in the title. My comments are as follows: The title is somewhat provocative including COVID-19 pandemic in it. However, this case has nothing to do with the pandemic. It is just the circumstances we lived in right now. The patient was eventually not infected with SARS-CoV-2. Interestingly, in this broad sense each rare disease case could be described as something new amidst the COVID crisis. Nevertheless, the manuscript is well written and contribute to the overall knowledge. Style of writing is flawless.
