Abstract

BACKGROUND

Infiltrating ductal breast carcinoma with monoclonal gammopathy of undetermined significance (MGUS) is rare and easily misdiagnosed. Most patients are first diagnosed with MGUS. We report a rare case of MGUS secondary to infiltrating ductal breast carcinoma. We also review the literature to analyze the clinical characteristics and diagnostic methods.

The patient opted for **breast-conserving lumpectomy** of the left breast. The histopathological report showed the tumor cells are arranged in cords, nests, and as individual cells confirming **infiltrating ductal carcinoma** (2 mm) with Nottingham Grade II [Figure 5]. After surgery, four cycles of docetaxel and cyclophosphamide were given every 21 days.

This **report** presents a rare **case** of a 35-year-old man with dual malignancy in the same breast. The patient had two separate nodules, one with the morphology of **invasive papillary carcinoma** and the other having features of an **infiltrating ductal carcinoma**. To the best of our knowledge this is the first **case report** describing the coexistence of these two entities.
