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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors described a very interesting and rare case of neoplastic mass within the pancreas. We would like to the authors for some additional iconographic data to increase the clarity of its representation. Minor Commnets: 1) During the PPPD procedure the authors reported having only four regional limphnodes. This number is less than the standard requirements for assessing TNM and disease staging. We strongly recommend that the authors take a look at the surgical specimens and rephrase the staging of the limphnodes. 2) The quality of figure 3 is not so excellent. The authors could try to present a beautiful image showing PAS staining in the tumor. 3) A picture of the Hemotoxylin and Eosin status of the pancreatic lesion is strongly suggested. 4) A n english language polishing is required.
