I answered the questions raised by the reviewers as follows:

“It is an interesting case report. I think it would be useful to explain the following issues.

Is splenectomy performed laparoscopically? “

--Yes. We had a laparoscopic splenectomy. (I have added the word of “laparoscopically” in the text. See the line156.)

“Was the liver checked during the surgery?”

--Yes, we explored the liver during the operation, the liver’s surface was smooth and no abnormal nodules was found on the surface of liver. (I added this description in the text. See the line 157.)

“After the diagnosis of metastasis, was a liver biopsy performed?”

--No, we did not do a liver biopsy. One reason is the result of MRI scan was very clear. Another one is the patient gave up treatment and left the hospital on his own when we explained the result of MRI. A week later, we got the news of the patient’s death.

“In manuscript text: Similar results were repeated in the treatment and outcome section.”

--I have deleted the repetitive narration in the treatment section.

“The bcl 1 test is important in the distinction between Kaposi and angiosarcoma. Should be highlighted in the text.”

--I have added the related discussion in the text. See the line191.
