SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The manuscript written by Pan w et al. reports a case with hepatic abscess caused by penetration of fishbone from the duodenum. It is an interesting case, but there are some concerns that need to be addressed. Major points. 1. The tumorous lesion was first misdiagnosed as cystadenocarcinoma. However, the patient had had CT scan test performed at another hospital. If the imaging was confirmed at the admission of the hospital, the correct diagnosis should have been made at that point. The authors should make a comment on that point. 2. The data on tumor markers such as CEA or CA19-9 should have been demonstrated. Minor point 1. The MRI imaging with contrast medium shows thin wall of the tumorous lesion, which may rather suggest abscess than cystadenocarcinoma.
