SUMMARY Previous studies reported that most of the intracranial dermoid cyst ruptures were spontaneous, and only a few were traumatic, with asymptomatic much rarer than the symptomatic ruptures. Authors reported the rare case of asymptomatic traumatic rupture of an intracranial dermoid cyst. **MAJOR STRENGTHS** 1. The text is relatively well-organized with logical formatting, and it is of appropriate length. 2. The readers may be interesting this rare case; this case suggests for a traumatic intracranial dermoid cyst rupture, conservative treatment or only follow-up visits could be adopted according to the patient's neurological examination results. **MAJOR WEAKNESSES** 3. In case summary of abstract After 1 conservative observation, no change was observed in the updated cranial CT scan. -> After 1 week? 4. In conclusion of abstract Asymptomatic traumatic rupture of intracranial dermoid cyst could be just followed up rather than treated aggressively. -> Asymptomatic traumatic rupture of intracranial dermoid cyst could be just followed up or conservative treatment rather than treated aggressively. 5.
