Cytomegalovirus (CMV) infection, usually associated with an immunosuppressed host, can cause symptomatic **gastrointestinal disease** in an immunocompetent patient. Although CMV can affect the entire **gastrointestinal** tract, the colon is most commonly involved, followed by the small bowel 1. Clinical manifestations may range from mild anorexia to obvious **gastrointestinal** bleeding and perforation.

Nov 28, 2016 · Very low birth weight and extremely low birth weight newborns are at higher risk of symptomatic **CMV infection**, most commonly **secondary** and acquired through breast milk.

**Gastrointestinal** involvement is rare in acquired **CMV infections**, but it could be an important manifestation of postnatal infection in preterm infants admitted to neonatal intensive care units.
