It is a well-structured case report, showing an interesting, but not necessarily original, approach. The case is well reported, I would call attention in the text to the estimated percentage of malignancy of Gastric Glomus. A controversy point is not performing biopsy in the preoperative period, even though the patient had made a choice for surgical resection (as informed by the authors), since the suspicion of malignancy could lead to the need for change the approach. I would reinforce the discussion of this argument.

This is a case report regarding gastric glomus tumor. I have the following comments:

Most of the sentences in the introduction are unreferenced. Please add the correct references to justify what was described in the text. The multidisciplinary section with the name of the expert is not appropriate. Please remove it. The abbreviation of gastric glomus tumor should be reported the first time the authors consider the topic (before discussion). Several definitions are repeated in the discussion (that the authors have already reported). How long is the follow-up? Many surgeons would still have performed a biopsy of the lesion and a possible resection. The choice of the authors was found to be right, but I believe in the clinical practice management it is very difficult to make it. The title must be changed to: "combined laparoscopic-endoscopic approach for gastric glomus tumor:....."
