This topic is very interesting. We have some comments that we hope the author can consider and further improve the manuscript: #1. The article incorporates some scarce researches and puts forward opinions based on these. The author should disclose his literature search strategy, I think, to ensure that his opinions are comprehensive and unbiased. On this point, I hope the author can seriously consider it. #2. On my standing opinion, the three subsections of "Family functioning", "The role of development" and "Mental health problems" are part of an in-depth discussion of the dynamic bidirectional system between psychosocial factors and T1DM. Can you consider starting another section? #3. Keywords and subsection titles can be optimized to make the overall article more structured.
