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Injury of the **extrahepatic biliary** system after blunt trauma is a **relatively rare** entity. The first **report** of bile duct rupture was in 1799 by Wainwright [2,3]. Bourque et al [4] in his review of the literature in 1989 found only 125 **cases** reported since 1806, one third of which were in the pediatric population. Dawson et al [5] reported 1 **case** of **bile duct injury** in 10,500 consecutive trauma patients.
