However, the conclusive data on this issue is lacking. The questions raised by the reviewers should be answered; and (3) Format: There is 1 table and 1 figure. (4) References: A total of 60 references are cited, including 6 references published in the last 3 years; (5) Self-cited references: There are no self-cited references; and (6) References recommend: The authors have the right to refuse to cite improper references recommended by peer reviewer(s), especially the references published by the peer reviewer(s) themselves.
