Pancreatoduodenectomy is involved many organs, and its operation is complex and the scope of operation is large, which can cause great trauma in patients and has the high occurrence rate of complications. Not all patients can adopt the only pancreaticojejunostomy, among which, the pancreatojejunostomy and the bundled pancreaticojejunostomy are commonly used. There are still some differences about what kind of pancreaticojejunostomy is more favorable to patients. In this study, the authors reviewed the curative effect of pancreaticojejunostomy and binding pancreaticojejunostomy in pancreatoduodenectomy and analyzed the multiple factors of postoperative pancreatic leakage. This study overall is very interesting. The methods are reasonable and results are well discussed. Comments: 1. The manuscript requires a minor language editing. Please take attention about the spellings. And some blanks between the words are missing, such as: Abstract, methods “operation,between which,the” should be “operation, between which, the”, Abstract, results “differencesof” should be “differences of” etc. Please check the manuscript carefully again. 2. It seems the figure is same as the table, please delete it. Or refer it in the main text.
