Comments to the author: The authors provide most up to date practical approaches that a GI fellow should be aware off on the problems and management of gastrointestinal and hepatobiliary diseases during COVID-19 pandemic. Diarrhea, hepatitis and other gastrointestinal disorders are common with COVID-19 disease. It is necessary to management of gastroenterology serious. The main content are: - endoscopy practice -Acute diarrhea - inflammatory bowel disease - management and follow up of IBD patients - potential harmful effects of proton pomp inhibitors treatment on COVID-19 acute pancreatitis - mechanisms of acute liver injury in patients with COVID-19 - liver transplantation - immunosuppressive drugs (autoimmune liver diseases& Liver transplant recipients). The relevant gastrointestinal diseases considered by the authors provide a comprehensive review of COVID-19 disease. The major problem with this article, in my opinion, is the English language. The authors should consider having the manuscript revised by a native speaker or refer to language support. There are some exit spelling mistakes. Apart from this formal requirement, I wonder whether the authors had access to other drug information regarding COVID-19 with gastrointestinal diseases. It would be interesting to report more extensively on other medications target to gut-lung, both traditional medicine and others. Besides, how do you understand that the mechanisms of COVID-19 related gastrointestinal diseases? The theory of gut-lung axis maybe provides a wider though to you, and it better to present the brief specification or pictures about mechanisms of COVID-19 related gastrointestinal diseases.
